

LPCANC SUPERVISION TRAINING: FORTY-FIVE HOUR WORKSHOP

June 24-25 (Friday and Saturday) and July 29-30 (Friday and Saturday)

Quality developmentally focused supervision education can be hard to find, especially training in which live supervision practice is at the forefront. This workshop series consists of practical, multimodal, experiential training that can be completed in four days. Presenters, Dr. Shirley Huffman and Dr. Dwaine Phifer, have spent the past nine years refining the material, the format for this workshop and developing the Mirror-in-the-Mirror technique for training supervisors.

Limited enrollment: 18 maximum—10 minimum. Because of the developmental nature of this 4-day workshop, participants must commit to all four sessions in order to get credit full credit.

Details: Participants will video record a pre-workshop supervision session to present during the second day. The video must be playable either from a disk or a flashdrive in Microsoft Media Player. A second video is required for day three. Participants will thus be able to compare and contrast pre/post skills. The sessions can be either an actual supervision session or with someone acting as a supervision client. (Video release required.) These videos will be reviewed during intense individual and group workshop supervision. The workshop offers in-depth coverage of feedback delivery, supervision models, intentionality, ethical and legal implications, multicultural/diversity issues, goal setting, supervision methods and techniques, assessment, contrast between group and individual supervision, self-assessment, group process, termination and thorough supervised practice of supervision skills. Between the first session and the second, participants will prepare a multicultural/diversity research presentation for the group, basing your project on current documented research. Email address, contact information, including telephone numbers, are necessary for registration.
